#### Master List Update:

The CathPCI Registry has updated the v5 Master Devices list, Device ID 4648 Intravascular Lithotripsy (IVL) System has been retired. This device is replaced with Device ID 5062 Shockwave Intravascular Lithotripsy (IVL) System as of 4/1/21 to accommodate capturing the device measurements.

If you are using the ACC's online data collection tool, this update has been applied and no action is required. If you are using a vendor tool, please follow the vendor's instructions for updating the intracoronary device list.

#### **Upcoming Call For Data Deadline Approaching on April 15th, 2021:**

To ensure a successful Call for Data Deadline occurring on April 15th, 2021 at 11:59:59 PM EST, NCDR participants are encouraged to submit Q4 2020 (patients discharged between Oct 1st, 2020 and Dec 31st 2020) data early, and obtain a green/passing status. If your facility has no eligible patients for submission during this quarter, please proceed in submitting the quarter to confirm a zero patient quarter.

When submitting a question, please ensure the title reflects the registry of interest as well as the topic at hand.
